You are consistent and in line with these SOSORT guidelines in your daily clinical practice, and therefore you can also publicly declare (e.g, on brochures, website etc.) that you apply the SEAS approach to your patients.

Obtaining SEAS certification does not authorise you to teach the technique to other colleagues; it solely permits you to apply it in patient care.
